PRINTING AND BINDING OF REVISED EDITION OF CANNON'S PROCEDURE IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. GREEN. Mr. President, House Joint Resolution 385, authorizing the printing and binding of a revised edition of Cannon's Procedure in the House of Representatives, has just been received from the House of Representatives. The joint resolution relates entirely to the business of the House, namely, the publication of this manuscript. Therefore I request that the Chair lay the joint resolution before the Senate; and then I shall ask unanimous consent for the immediate consideration of the joint resolution, without having it referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration.

The PRESIDING OFFICER laid before the Senate the joint resolution (H. J. Res. 385) authorizing the printing and binding of a revised edition of Cannon's Procedure in the House of Representatives and providing that the same shall be subject to copyright by the author, which was read twice by its title.

The PRESIDING OFFICER. Is there objection to the request of the Senator from Rhode Island?

Mr. KNOWLAND. Mr. President, this measure has also been taken up with both the acting majority leader and the minority leader; and inasmuch as the joint resolution deals with the workings of the other body, as a matter of comity between the two Houses I would not insist that the joint resolution be referred to committee.

The PRESIDING OFFICER. Is there objection to the request of the Senator from Rhode Island?

There being no objection, the joint resolution (H. J. Res. 385) was considered, ordered to a third reading, read the third time, and passed.
