EXTENSION OF PATENT TO THE
UNITED DAUGHTERS OF THE
CONFEDERACY

The Senate proceeded to consider the bill (S. 732) granting an extension of patent to the United Daughters of the Confederacy, which had been reported from the Committee on the Judiciary with an amendment on page 1, line 5, after the figures "29,611", to insert "which is the insignia of the United Daughters of the Confederacy", so as to make the bill read:

Be it enacted etc., That (a) a certain design patent issued by the United States Patent Office of date November 8, 1898, being patent numbered 29,611 which is the insignia of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, which was renewed and extended for a period of 14 years by Public Law No. 220, 77th Congress, approved August 18, 1941, is hereby renewed and extended for an additional period of 14 years from and after the date of enactment of this act, with all the rights and privileges pertaining to the same, being generally known as the insignia of the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

(b) No person who has manufactured the design of such patent between August 18, 1955, and the date of the enactment of this act shall be held liable for infringement of such patent by reason of the continued manufacture and sale thereof.

The amendment was agreed to.

The bill was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading, read the third time, and passed.
