PRETRIAL ORDER

Pursuant to stipulation of the parties, it is ordered that the subsequent course of this action prior to trial will be controlled by the following:

1. Each party shall mark its own exhibits and shall furnish a list of such exhibits to the other parties not later than March 25, 1967 with respect to exhibits relating to issues as to which each party has the burden of proof (i.e., the Foundation as to its Amended Complaint; Blonder-Tongue as to its Counterclaim; and JFD as to its Cross-Claim). A list of

exhibits to be used by a party in defense shall be furnished to the other parties not later than April 5, 1967.

2. Unless written objection is filed with the court not later than April 15, 1967, the court will consider objections to identification of the listed exhibits to be waived, other objections being reserved. All of the listed exhibits shall be made available for inspection on request by opposing counsel in sufficient time so that objection to identification can be made as set forth above.

3. Each party will also furnish to the other parties a list of its witnesses and a brief statement of the nature of their testimony, said lists to be supplied not later than March 25, 1967 in connection with its case in chief and not later than April 5, 1967 as to its defense.

4. None of the above provisions shall be applicable to exhibits or witnesses to be used in rebuttal.

5. The parties shall exchange trial briefs, with copies to the court, not later than April 25, 1967.
