Dear Mr. Rockman:

After careful consideration, the Copyright Office Board of Appeals has decided to register Flanders Brilliant Cut Diamond. The registration is only for the three dimensional faceted stone because of the complexity of the overall sculptural configuration. We rarely see such complexity in gemstones used in jewelry design, and we cannot recall previously making such a registration. The registration, of course, does not cover any aspect of the faceting process.

As you know courts have held that copyright protection in this type of work is limited. For example, in Weindling International Corp. v. Kobi Katz Inc., 56 USPQ2d 1763, 1766 (2000), the court determined that a jewelry design was copyrightable, if not slavishly copied; it stated, however, that it "follows, of course, that the protection is a narrow one, for it applies only to the unique combination and arrangement of otherwise uncopyrightable elements into the particular design."

We are also returning the replica of the gemstone.
