

Title: Arizona Code, 1939, Vol. 3

Question: Variance in the statement of authorship in the copy and application.

The copy contains a statement of authorship as follows:

"Compiled under the supervision of the Members of the Supreme Court of Arizona: Chief Justice Henry D. Ross; Associate Justices, Alfred C. Lockwood, Archibald G. McAlister." In addition to these names in line (3) of the application, appears the statement: "The Publisher's Editorial Staff," which requires an explanation. This is the second application filed within the past two weeks (see application for Vol. 1 of this title) which has added the Publisher's Editorial Staff to the accredited statement of authorship on the title page of these volumes of the Arizona Code. This accredited statement only will be used in the title cards made and used by the Library of Congress and issued by them to other libraries. It is the opinion of the undersigned that the records of the Copyright Office should agree with these published cards. And that such authorship as may be vested in the Publisher's Editorial Staff should be made the subject of an explanatory statement after the title, in line (6) of the application.

MINORITY MEMORANDUM

October 10, 1940

Remitter: Babson's Reports, Inc.

Title: "Truths from Babson's Reports on Investment for Protection and Profit" (& 13 others).

Question: Appears to be one work--doubtful as separate publications.

Mrs. Brady dissents from the majority opinion with respect to separate registration ab initio, of the pages of this book, because the requirement of deposit of the complete work is not met. This is one work, identifiable by the title "Truths from Babson's Reports," and should be recorded under that title. Moreover, the registration of the title page alone does not meet the requirements of the law with respect to deposit. However, as publication with notice protects all copyrightable component parts, the subsequent registration of the separate pages might be permissible as they bear separate notices of copyright. If it is desirable to register in this manner, copyright having been recorded for the whole work, the registrations of the separate pages should be made under their specific titles, followed by the analytical note: "Page 2 of 'Truths from Babson's Reports on Investment for Protection and Profit.'"
