ORDER

TIMOTHY J. SAVAGE, Judge.

AND NOW, this 16th day of September, 2004, upon consideration of Plaintiff Angelo Fan Brace Licensing, LLC Memorandum of Law on the Proper Interpretation of the Claims in U.S. Pat. 5,762,223 for *Markman* Hearing (Docket No. 30), Allied Moulded's Response to Angelo's *Markman* Brief (Docket No. 33), the Results of Conference of Counsel as to Construction of Non-Disputed Terms in U.S. Pat. 5,762,223 (Docket No. 29), and after a hearing at which the parties agreed that the dispute is whether United States Patent 5,762,223 ('223) specifies that the invention must contain separate junction boxes, it is **ORDERED** that the meaning and scope of patent claims 10, 11 and 12 are as follows: FN1

1. The patent claims an electrical junction box for use with hanging a heavy object from a joist/beam in a ceiling area.
2. The electrical junction box is comprised of two junction boxes.
3. The first junction box is a pancake dish and the second junction box is an upstanding lead box.
4. The boxes are two separate components that are joined to form an electrical junction box.
5. The first and second junction boxes can be either separate or integral.
6. Together the first junction box and the second junction box have an L-shaped configuration.

FN1. This Order is issued now to assist the parties in proceeding expeditiously. The court's analysis and explanation of its claim construction will follow at a later time.
