***ORDER ON CLAIM CONSTRUCTION***

After consideration of the briefs and the parties' oral arguments, and consistent with the Court's statements and rulings during the claim construction hearing on March 16, 2005, the Court hereby adopts the following constructions of claim terms in U.S. Patent No. 5,793,028.

<b>Claim Term</b>	<b>Construction</b>
"transmitting ... to ... from "and "transmitting ... from ... to"	Moving or sending, via any communication link, from the sender to the receiver
"Including"	Containing
"Transaction initiation request"	All data that is transmitted in a transmission requesting a transaction
"Verification request"	All data that is transmitted in a transmission requesting verification
"Acknowledgment response"	All data that is transmitted in a transmission responding to an acknowledgment request
"public identification code uniquely identifying the transactionor computer"	A code that singularly identifies the computer used by the transactionor, but not only the transactionor himself or herself, which is accessible at least to all parties to the electronic transaction
"private identification code uniquely identifying the transactionor computer"	A nonpublic code that singularly identifies the computer used by the transactionor, but not only the transactionor himself or herself
"Indicating one of a valid electronic transaction and an invalid electronic transaction"	Signifying that the electronic transaction either (1) corresponds to a transaction initiation request formulated by the transactionor or (2) does not correspond to a transaction initiation request formulated by the transactionor
