A BILL

Granting an extension of patent to the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That a certain design patent issued by the United States
4 Patent Office of date November 8, 1898, being patent num-
5 bered 29,611, which is the insignia of the United Daughters
6 of the Confederacy, which was renewed and extended for a
7 period of fourteen years by Public Law Numbered 213,
8 Eighty-eighth Congress, approved December 18, 1963, is
9 hereby renewed and extended for an additional period of
10 fourteen years from and after the date of enactment of this
11 Act, with all rights and privileges pertaining to the same,

1 being generally known as the insignia of the United Daugh-
2 ters of the Confederacy.
